

## Walter Ware

1814 - 17 January 1879

Walter Ware was born in Buxted in 1814 and baptised on 8th May of that year.

His parents were Thomas Ware (1776-1854) and Lucy Longly (1771-1841).

On 10th November 1835 Walter married Mary Jarvis at St. Nicholas Church, Brighton and they set up home in Buxted. Walter and Mary had one daughter Caroline (1836-1883).

At that time Walter was a farmer, but in the 1861 census his occupation is listed as a Higler. There are two descriptions of the word higler one was a door to door seller of goods, the other a man who went from farm to farm with his own horse working on the farm.

By 1871 Walter had gone back to farming 10 acres, and the family lived at Lantern Farm, Danehill. He is listed as a dealer in cattle.

Caroline lived at home until her marriage to Civil Engineer, Henry Barrett on 12th June 1860.

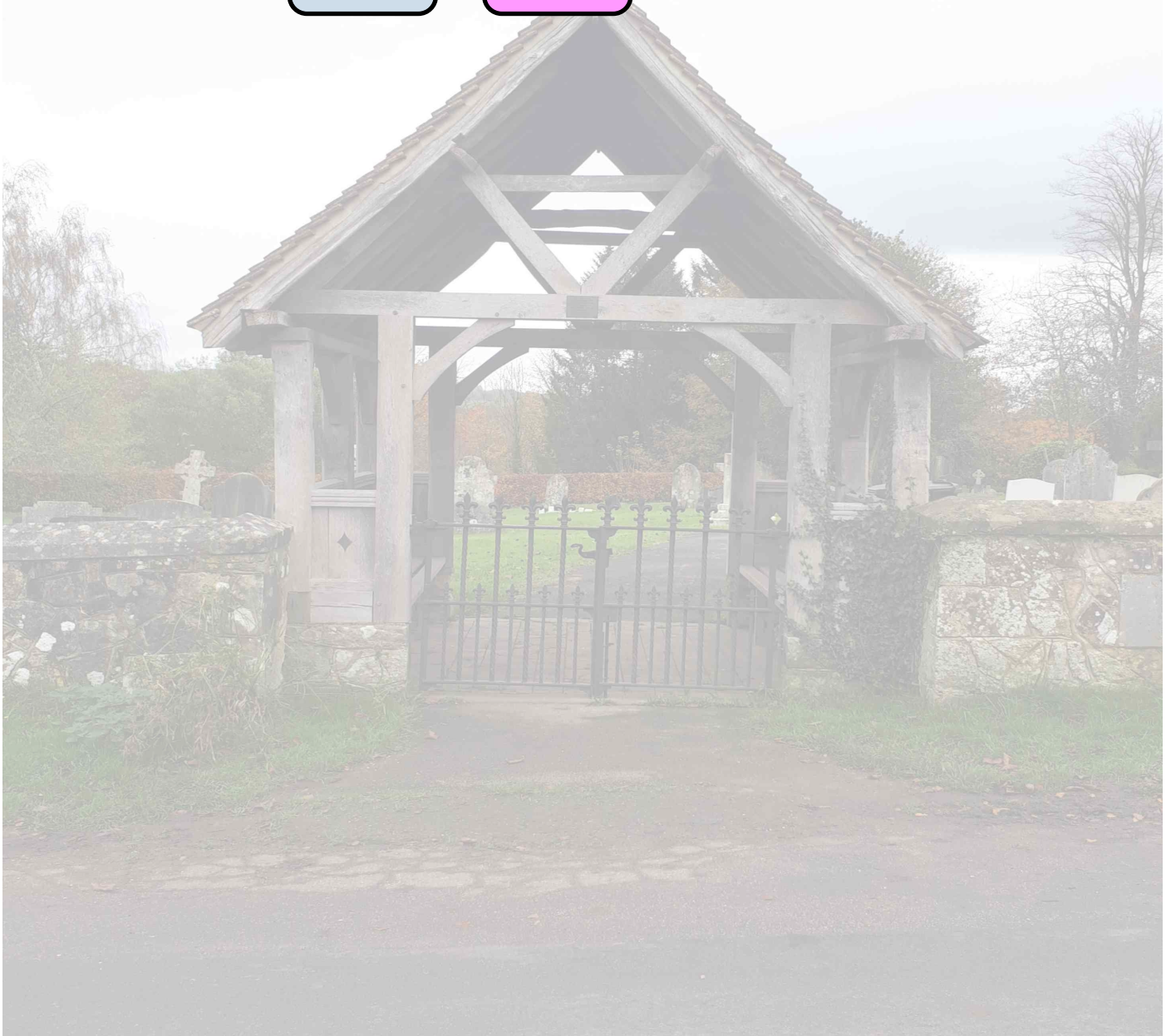
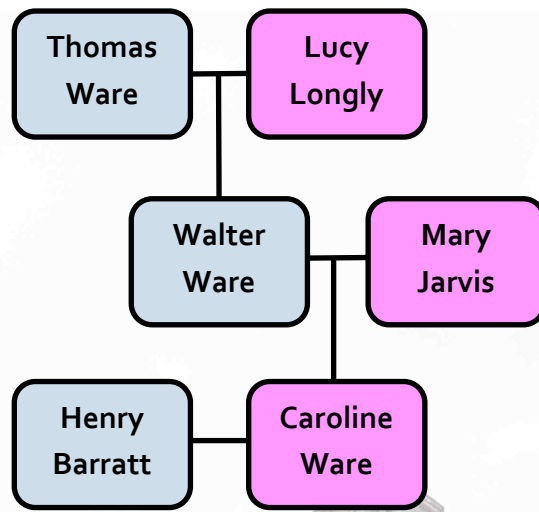
