

Elizabeth Williams (nee Bennett)

18 May 1877 - 12 June 1948

Elizabeth Bennett was born on 18th May 1877 in Lewes, Sussex.

Her parents were Alfred Bennett (1844-1927) and Elizabeth Stedman Cox (1842—1923). (see Bennett Family). Her father's occupation was a sawyer. Elizabeth had 7 siblings; George, William, Albert, Thomas, Laura, Charles and Daisy.

In 1891, aged 13 years, Elizabeth was living at home with her parents and siblings in Nutley Street, Maresfield.

She married Alfred Samson Williams on 4th June 1900 and they moved to Danehill, where they had two sons, Alfred born in 1901 and Jack in 1905.

WW1 took her husband, Alfred, away into the Army and he served as a Private in The Durham Light Infantry, surviving and being discharged on 17th March 1919.

In 1939 at the start of WW2 Elizabeth and Alfred were living at 2, Rose Cottages, Danehill. By this time their sons had left home.

She died on 12th June 1948. She was buried in row C at Danehill cemetery on 16th June 1948. No headstone can be found
