

Harry Woolgar

Died 12 January 1956

Harry was baptised as Henry, he was born 9th June 1890 in Watringbury, Kent, to parents William Woolgar and Amy Walters. His father was an agricultural labourer. Harry had 10 siblings; William, Annie, Emily, George, Horace, Florence, Jane, Ellen, Louisa and Daisy.

In 1891 Harry was living with his family in North Pole Road, Watringbury, but by 1901 the family had moved to Liver Street, Teston, in Kent.

The 1911 census records Harry living in Oak Road, Watringbury, but by 1921 he and his wife Daisy were sharing a house with Daisy's mother in Maidstone. Harry's occupation was a Motor Driver for Willet and Robinson, Sheet Metal Workers in Maidstone. Harry served in WWI in The Army Service Corps as a driver. Harry and Daisy May Hodge had married in July 1919 in the Maidstone District. The 1939 register lists Harry as a chauffeur living at Chelworth Cottage, Chelwood Gate. Harry and Daisy stayed at Chelworth Cottage until his death on 12th January 1956. He had been admitted to The North Western Hospital in Hampstead where he died from cancer and heart disease. He was buried at Danehill cemetery on 18th January 1956.

NOTE TO BE TAKEN BY RECRUIT ON ATTESTATION.

Henry Woolgar I solemnly declare that I will be faithful and true to His Majesty the King, His Heirs and Successors, and that I will, as to duty, honour, loyalty and fidelity, defend His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, His Person, Crown, and dignity against all enemies, and will observe and obey all Orders of His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, and of the General and Officers of His Majesty's Army, as they may be given.

OFFICER OF MAGISTRATES OR ATTESTING OFFICER.

The Recruit above named was examined by me that if he made any false answer to any of the above questions he would be liable to be punished as provided in the Army Act.

The above questions were first read to the Recruit in my presence. I have taken care that he understood each question, and that he answered each question as he intended to reply to, and the said Recruit has made and signed the declaration as contained in the above form.

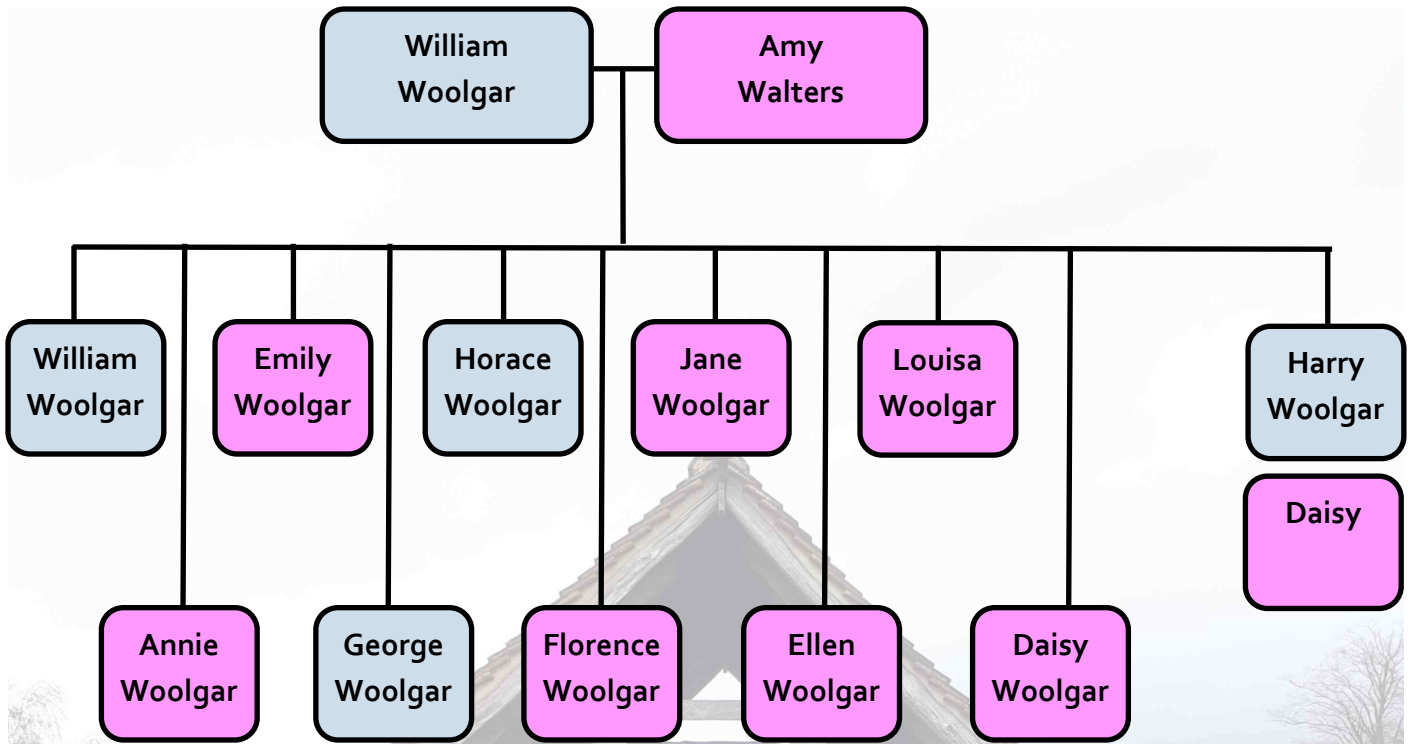
† This signature of the Attesting Officer is to be added to the prototype of the Recruit. It shall carry the "Stamp" for which C.O. Form B. 2001 is the form.

All on the Recruit is to be read the provisions of the Army Act, and to profess, if possible, the Oath of the Army and Certificate of Enlistment which should be returned to him accordingly enclosed in the form, as before, and should be returned to the Recruit.
